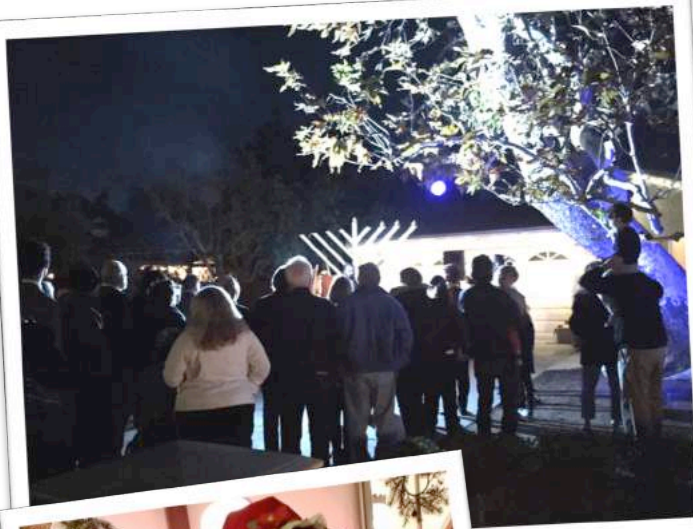

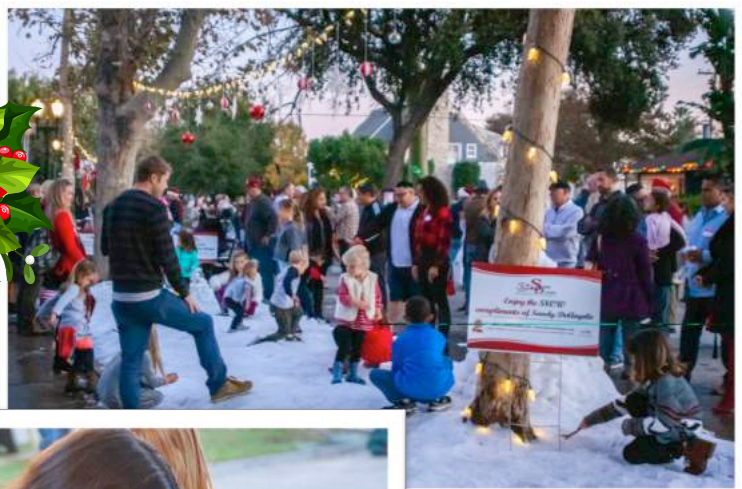

Legacy Awards

We were honored to present three Legacy Awards in 2018, to some of our dearest and most generous neighbors. If you missed it, we presented the Legacy Awards at the General Meeting in November, which also served as a ribbon-cutting celebration for our new Legacy Walk in Sarah Mae Downie Park. The names of all our Legacy Award recipients will be engraved on the walkway bricks, to serve as a forever-fond tribute to those of you who have done so much for Floral Park! Here's a little about our most recent recipients...

Nicki Curran

Nicki has lived in Floral Park almost her entire life, which in itself is a testament to her devotion to our neighborhood. But she has also made a unique mark, as one of the many crucial members of our Home & Garden Tour committee and has been a key contributor to our cherished way of life in Floral Park.

Nicki grew up in Floral Park, and although she moved away for college and her early career in education and athletics, her close bonds and heartfelt memories brought her back home, literally, when she purchased her parents' house on Santa Clara in 1996. It was also in 1996 that Nicky got involved with the Floral Park Home & Garden Tour. At the time of its inception, The Home & Garden Tour was an effort to preserve the beauty of the neighborhood and bring back families and kids to Floral Park, to "the way it used to be," when Nicki was young, and she was dedicated from Day 1. Nicki's position as Docent Coordinator is probably one of the most complex and challenging jobs, having to manage over 450 volunteers who work 3-hour shifts at 5-7 homes over 2 long days every year. She is responsible for soliciting, reminding, securing, placing (and at often times replacing), the temporary guides and caretakers of our historic Home Tour homes and gardens. She still maintains paper records and keeps a 3x5 card for each volunteer to organize the mammoth task of staffing the homes and gardens on display, making sure docents know their facts, can be with their friends, change a shift, get a chair, and are recognized for their service - docents keep coming back year after year to help, and this has a lot to do with how they are treated by Nicki and the whole Home Tour Docent team. Nicki recounts her own story about a time her yard needing watering right before her own home was on tour one year, and how the neighbors just rushed in to help without a question. She feels that this is truly what Floral Park is all about - neighbors looking out for each other and caring about the whole neighborhood. We know you helped inspire and cultivate this sentiment, Nicki, thank you for all you've done for Floral Park!



Charlene Hanson

For many Floral Park residents, Charlene Hanson represented more than just the mail; she represented the charm and community that is Floral Park. On June 17, 2017, while walking home from church, Charlene was taken from our community forever.

Charlene walked the streets of Floral Park, mail trolley in hand, for 42 years, but her relationship with Floral Park goes back farther. Charlene was a true Santa Ana native, attending both St. Joseph Elementary and Mater Dei. Growing up, Charlene and her sister spent many happy weekends with their grandparents on Heliotrope, in the heart of Floral Park. When she first started working for the postal service, Charlene was stationed in several locations ranging from Santa Ana to Irvine before finding her home at King Street. On one of her first days delivering mail to Floral Park, she was charged by an off-leash golden retriever. Unprepared for the situation, she instinctively yelled, "Go get your ball!" It worked! This is just one example of the wit that made the residents of Floral Park welcome Charlene into their lives. Her sister recalls that Charlene took great joy in getting to know the Floral Park community on her route and watching the children grow up along the way. Charlene was an active member of St Joseph Church and supported the school through her volunteerism. She was also a supporter of the Floral Park Home Tour, and the unofficial purveyor of margaritas. She made a lasting impression on everyone she met and will be fondly remembered by Floral Park.

Beverley Schauwecker

"Bev" Schauwecker is one of our most cherished advocates of Floral Park. In 1982, she had her house on tour for Heritage Orange County, to help raise funds to oppose the Broadway overpass. It was about the same time Floral Park was forming a neighborhood association, so she got involved to ensure its success, and it was full steam ahead! Beverley has held, at one time or another, every office on the board except president and treasurer. She steadfastly believes "you need to get involved with the 'hood, if you want to keep informed."

In 1983, Beverley organized the first Neighborhood Watch for Victoria Drive, which drew almost every neighbor on the street as a supporter. She has also headed up many committees over the years, supporting FPNA, preferring to offer help to committees and board members of the association, and stay out of the limelight. When Sandy started gathering people for the Home & Garden Tour, Bev jumped in with both feet, and she is still involved over 26 years later! Bev worked with Nicki Curran to develop the docent volunteer program, and they have been close friends ever since. Home Tour is one of her passions, and at one time or another Beverley has worn every hat, except that of Director. Beverley is proud to say, "We have fun while working for a good cause, thanks to our leader." And Beverley, thanks to you, Floral Park is a warm and inviting place to call home! As a tribute to all of her support and efforts, Bev Schauwecker received the Neighborhood Hero award in 2010. You are a true Floral Park Legacy!

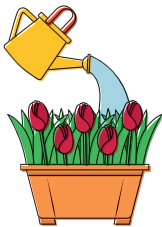

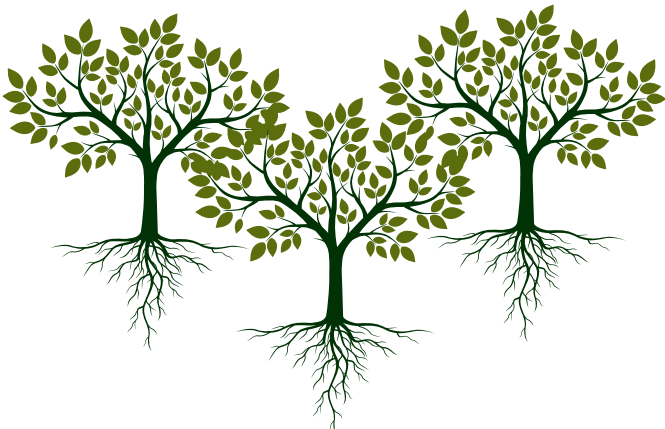

As residents of Floral Park, we know we have one of the most engaging neighborhoods in all of America, but did you know we were also recognized a decade or so ago as the “USA Neighborhood of the Year?” One of our most unique and attractive attributes that helped secure this honor is our yearly Floral Park Home & Garden Tour, which takes place every April. It’s time to mark your calendar for the 27th rendition of this wonderful event, scheduled for Saturday & Sunday, April 27th and 28th (10am-4pm each day)! You don’t want to miss it!! We will feature beautiful homes and gardens south of Santa Clara, in addition to our Street of Treasures, Classic Car Show and food & beverages, along one of our grandest streets, Victoria Drive.

We’re asking for volunteers (approximately 520, in fact) so please consider giving your time. Volunteers receive a ticket to the Tour as our thanks!

In addition, the Wine & Beer Garden – which has been a spectacular hit over the past two years -- returns better than ever, open this year from 11am-6pm both days. Entertainment will be provided!

“Spirits for Education”

If you haven’t experienced the Wine & Beer Garden, here’s a little history: Each year, a percentage of the profits generated by the Floral Park Home & Garden Tour fund five, \$1,000 scholarships for Santa Ana students. In 2017, the Home Tour committee embarked on a new fundraising activity to boost funds. A Wine Garden was added, with the intent of donating all proceeds to the scholarship cause. Building upon that first-year experience the offerings were expanded to include beer. That change, along with the generosity of several neighbors, allowed us to underwrite the entire Wine & Beer Garden in 2018. And although we fell short of our goal to double the scholarship total, we were able to add 3 more, and Floral Park endowed a total of eight, \$1,000 scholarships!

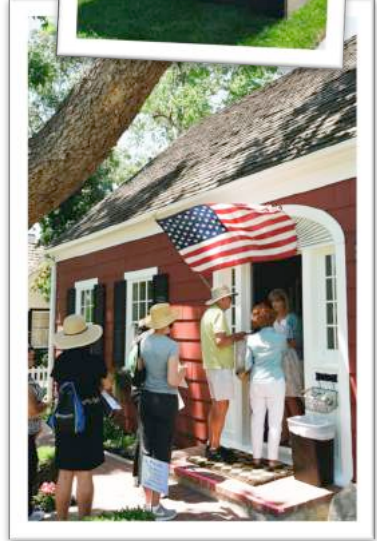
This year the goal is to increase the scholarships total to 12, between profits from the Home Tour and proceeds from the Wine & Beer Garden. In other words, *Go big or go home!*

Here’s what we need from you:

1. Participate in enjoying our event from 11am-6pm on the days of the Tour.
2. Volunteer to help plan, canvas, setup/take down, pour wine and/or beer, wait tables, take tickets and ... (okay you get the picture).
3. Sponsor a case of wine by donating \$120 to purchase the pre-selected wine. While that is about one-eighth of a scholarship, sales from that case almost triple its impact on scholarship proceeds.

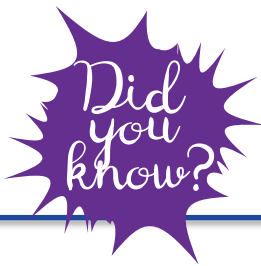

Using its built-in global positioning system "mySantaAna" will attach a location to the picture and route the information to the appropriate City department for resolution.
